Dear co-workers and friends of the Medical Section!

How can we, how can humanity succeed in the future in building a bridge from the physical to the spiritual and moral – the central topic of the world conference of the Medical Section in 2020? We sense that "corona" urges us to make a new start so that morally there can be no return to the world "before corona"; so that our ideals form a vital basis and are guiding stars which give us inner orientation and strength to avoid falling back into thinking and actions which reveal their destructive consequences with ever greater openness.

How will we celebrate the anniversary of Anthroposophic Medicine?

The young preparatory group of our world conference is striving for a festival of inspired and inspiring community building. We are thankful that the development of Covid-19 in Switzerland has made it possible for our conference to take place in its entirety at the Goetheanum. For all those for whom the world situation has made it impossible to travel from their continent to Europe, to Switzerland, we are planning to stream the festive event on 16 September 2020 and additional individual elements by video stream. At the

same time we are keen for regional meetings to be held in these countries in parallel with the world conference, e.g. from Friday to Sunday (18–20 September), which also have as their topic the hundredth anniversary of Anthroposophic Medicine.

"Looking back towards the future" can pose the question: how has Anthroposophic Medicine developed in the respective country and how is it prospering? What future perspective are we striving for? Anthroposophy and Anthroposophic Medicine live out of cultivating the inner sources which enable us to have a spiritual understanding of the challenges facing us: be it in the social sphere or globally, or in the encounter with the human being in sickness needing care. Always it is about developing our own senses so we can grasp the being of the other, the essence of the historical situation so that by this means we develop inner vitality and are prompted to take the initiative ourselves.

Here modern community building inspired by the future and healing spiritual forces is a central task on which the growth as well as the effectiveness of Anthroposophic Medicine is crucially dependent. How can we experience a common light, a common warmth, hearth warmth, both in meditation and in living encounter and collaboration? How can we organise such a festival in the Michaelmas period to inspire us and give us the strength, impulse and momentum for our tasks? We are asking ourselves these questions at the Goetheanum equally as they are being asked across countries on all continents.

We look forward to seeing you if it is possible for you to come and similarly to hearing from other countries about the initiatives developing there!

We have nevertheless postponed the performance of Beethoven's choral orchestral work, the Ninth Symphony, for medical reasons, just as we are responsibly taking account of the health aspect in general. Instead we will conclude our festive event on the afternoon of 16 September with the eurythmy performance "Strings of Light" by the Goetheanum Ensemble. It will include, among other things, the performance accompanied by eurythmy of two movements from the string quartet op. 132 by the composer: the final and middle movements; the latter is headed by the words "Sacred song of thanksgiving from a convalescent to the Deity, in the Lydian mode" – a unique work in the history of music. Other artistic contributions from creative speech, eurythmy and music will help to shape the conference. The up-todate programme for the week can be found on our website.

So in a time of social distancing we are called upon to reinforce our inner calm and strength and, on the other hand, to cultivate and intensify our social connections to the extent possible. That is how we can emerge strengthened from the corona crisis.

We are pleased that we were allowed to reopen the Goetheanum as a conference and cultural venue with the medical conference on Goethe's Faust, "Crises, precipices and development. The human being and medicine today", from 10–12 July and that in September the world conference of the Medical Section will be the first major conference at the Goetheanum after lockdown. Covid-19 will feature in its content.

"Perspectives and Initiatives in the Times of Coronavirus"

All the section leaders of the School of Spiritual Science joined together to publish a book (German title: Perspektiven und Initiativen zur Coronazeit) in just a few weeks in which they formulate perspectives and initiatives in the time of coronavirus. The English translation is due to be published by Rudolf Steiner Press in August under the title Perspectives and Initiatives in the Times of Coronavirus. The crisis of the present time requires initiatives across the sections. Thus it has become obvious that the modern intensive farming of game and livestock is morally indefensible, furthers

hunger on earth and endangers our health through the massive use of antibiotics and through stress-induced virus mutations which can jump to humans. We can respond to the call for a "one health" attitude to health only together with organic and preferably dynamic farming and the corresponding veterinary medicine. Only healthy farm organisms in which the livestock also occupy a dignified place are truly viable for the future. The same applies to the way we treat bees. Pesticides are the companions of modern monocultures, contrasting with healthy plant diversity and the corresponding care and breeding of seeds.

In these times we are learning to handle the Internet in creative ways. Here it is becoming apparent that it is our inner attentiveness which determines the extent to which we listen to one another over this medium, work together in it and can also speak about topics of spiritual experience. The English Training in Anthroposophic Medicine, the IPMT for Taiwan and China, and the current online further training on Covid-19, e.g. in Brazil and Germany, have learnt to use the Internet for their purposes in very different ways. More than 4000 people from 53 countries registered for the further training on Covid-19 on 12/13 June 2020 provided by the German medical association GAÄD, the team from Klinik Arlesheim and the Medical Section. It is likely to have been the largest anthroposophical medical further training event of the first 100 years of Anthroposophic Medicine in this regard.

A shorter, four-hour international <u>event on the same subject</u> is being planned by the IVAA in collaboration with the Medical Section for 18 July 2020.

A basic five-year eurythmy therapy training will start at the Goetheanum in early October 2020 as part of which it will be possible to study eurythmy and eurythmy therapy at the same time from day one as well as obtaining the Goetheanum diploma and full professional recognition in Switzerland in both disciplines. With this pilot project the Medical Section is taking account of the desire to combine art and the art of healing more intensively in training. The training is addressed to everyone who from the outset is aiming to work in a therapeutic/preventive capacity as a eurythmy therapist.

With the IPMT in Columbia in October 2020, a new five-year course to become an anthroposophical pharmacist is being prepared which will start in October 2021. Two further anthroposophical pharmacy training courses will start in Thailand and Eastern Europe (Krakow and Moscow) in 2021. Albert Schmidli, Mónica Mennet-von Eiff (Weleda) and Annette Greco (WALA) form the core of this further training initiative.

Reflection on the healing forces

In a unique way, Rudolf Steiner in his lecture of 13 October 1923 describes the interaction of the four archangelic beings over the course of the year. The centrepiece is formed by "the culmination of all healing truths about the human being" which he connects with the work of the Archangel Raphael. This is centred on the human breathing, including "what goes from the lungs to the heart and from the heart in turn through the whole of the blood circulation. [...] For all healing forces originally lie in the human respiratory system. And anyone who truly understands the scope of the breathing also knows the healing forces out of the human being" (GA 229, p. 74f.).

The time before corona was, seen globally, an ever more breathless time. We encounter many patients compromised in their breathing. If we want to give renewed vitality to the world, if we want to heal and work educationally, ecologically and socially in a healing way, it holds true for each one of us that we should consciously turn time and again to this source. At the same time we have to be conscious of our responsibility for the atmosphere which unites all ensouled beings on this earth; the atmosphere we create between us through the way we work together. In the mirror of the Covid-19 pathology we can learn to identify the healing forces in us, to cultivate them and act out of them.


